
A grand estate



Getting there



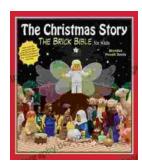
